PGCE Entry Requirements:	Degree or recognised equivalent qualification	
<i>England, Wales & N Ire:</i>	Leaving Certificate Ordinary Grade C (Grade B if applying in Wales) in English and Mathematics– check with individual colleges for specific requirements.	
<i>Scotland:</i>	Leaving Certificate English (Grade HC3), Mathematics (Grade OB3) or equivalent. – Check with individual colleges for specific requirements. If you do not hold the Leaving Certificate requirements, some institutions may offer special equivalence tests – check with individual colleges School based observation (minimum 2 days) is expected. Observation in a number of schools is preferred. Applicants will be expected to demonstrate relevance of their degree to the Curriculum.

Application Fee:	England/Wales £23 Sterling	Scotland €12 for one course or €23 for up to 5 choices
Closing Date:	Applications open from 26 th October 2015. England/Wales - There is no closing date. Some courses will fill up quickly so it is advisable to apply early Scotland: closing date 15 th January 2016	
Funding/Fees:	Training bursaries are offered for PGCE courses in England and Wales – amount offered depends on your subjects and the standard of your degree. ENGLAND - See http://www.education.gov.uk/get-into-teaching/funding/postgraduate-funding.aspx WALES – See http://teachertrainingcymru.org/node/16	
	Tuition fees of up to £9,000. Students in England, Wales and Northern Ireland can apply to the Student Loan Company to pay these fees directly to university initially. This is then payable to Student Loan Company, on completion of the course, once the newly qualified teacher is working and earning more than a specified amount “repayment threshold”. Skills Tests (England/Wales)	Online Skills Tests in Literacy and Numeracy must be completed before you start your course http://www.education.gov.uk/schools/careers/traininganddevelopment/professional/	
Routes:	While there are a number of routes (university based and school based) leading to qualification as a Post-Primary teacher in the UK, in order to be eligible to register with the Irish Teaching Council, it is important that the route you choose provides both an academic qualification, referred to as the Postgraduate/Professional Certificate in Education PGCE (England/Wales) and the Postgraduate Diploma in Education (Scotland) AND Qualified Teacher Status (QTS). For routes into teaching e.g. Teach First – see http://www.education.gov.uk/get-into-teaching and http://www.teachinscotland.org/getintoteaching/index.asp	
Returning to Ireland	Qualifications gained outside Ireland must be assessed by the Irish Teaching Council and must be similar to standard of qualification/amount of teaching practice hours completed by those completing teacher education in Ireland. From September 2014 there will be significant shortfalls in the comparison of qualifications obtained in the UK versus Irish teacher education qualifications. Ireland – Recognition of EU Qualifications

EC Directive 89/48: recognised primary school teachers in any other member state may seek similar recognition in this state.
Applicants must be fully qualified in the jurisdiction in which they trained – in UK this means completing teacher education programme (PGCE) AND Induction Year.
From 2014 -main shortfalls relate to number of credits taken, amount of supervised teaching hours as well as the History and Structure of the Irish Education System.
