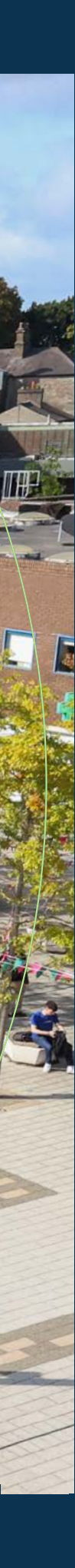

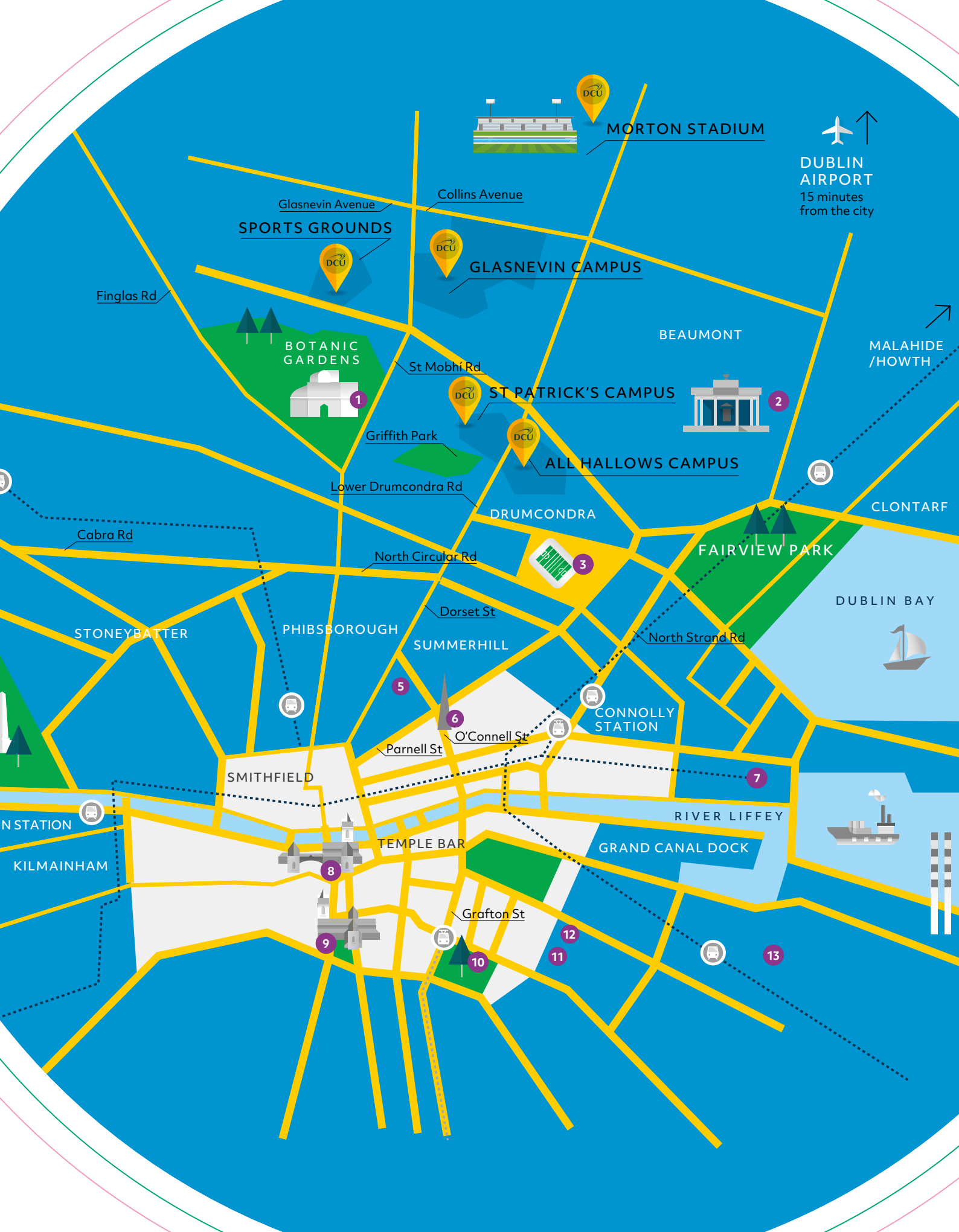

"Engineering is about asking questions, solving problems, designing and creating new solutions. Engineers are the craftspeople who use every available tool to design the world around us! A key feature therefore of the Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering postgraduate programmes is that we allow our students to be engineers from the day they start.

We introduce students to a vast array of tools, for them to use their knowledge and skills to select the right approach and apply the correct methodology to solve complex analytical, mathematical, technical, computational or economic challenges they are faced with.

We adapt our teaching to engage real world industry-relevant problems that resonate with students and their prospective employers. We offer students the choice of opting for a specialist Major in one of four areas: Simulation-driven Design, Advanced Manufacturing, Sustainable Systems and Energy, or Biomedical Engineering.

Our teaching goes beyond one-dimensional technical solutions and penetrates holistically into the socio-economic, regulatory and policy spheres that are often the real barrier to creating a sustainable future. The Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering postgraduate programmes are highly flexible to align with diverse student cohorts; the logical investigator, the designer, the manufacturer, the activist, the implementer and also those motivated students who work in industry at the same time as they study - our programme suits anyone who wants to progress into a more exciting, rewarding career."

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Mathieu Mercadier is the programme chair of the new MSc in Business Analytics. He is a researcher and lecturer in business analytics, with a focus on the intersection of finance, statistics, and machine learning.

"Like many of us, I have often wondered how we can make better decisions when the future is uncertain. That curiosity shaped my path, beginning with studying Economics and Quantitative Finance, and leading to a decade-long career in the financial sector. There, I discovered another computational approach to decision-making: Machine Learning, a powerful set of tools capable of uncovering patterns, enhancing predictions, and supporting decisions in ways traditional models could not.

While machine learning applied to finance remains a key focus of my research, a broader field has opened its doors to me: Business Analytics, an area that brings together the tools, techniques, and frameworks that help organisations make faster, smarter, evidence-based decisions.

What drives me today is the belief that data, when used responsibly and intelligently, can help solve real-world problems. But making the most of data requires more than technical skills. It demands critical thinking, business acumen, ethical awareness and strong communication skills. This is the mindset I strive to instil in my students, and this is why I designed the MSc in Business Analytics.

Students learn in an environment that reflects the real world, through challenge-based learning, virtual reality presentations, access to a new AI-ready Analytics Lab, and client-sponsored projects.

In an increasingly data-driven world, there is a critical need for people who can turn complexity into clarity and insight into action. This is more than a technical field; it is a way to shape the future. And that is why I do what I do."

Top Tips for Moving to Ireland

Moving abroad can be an exciting and life altering experience. We are also aware that it can come with some challenges. Therefore we have prepared a few of our top tips for students moving to Ireland to study at DCU.

Find Accommodation Early: Student housing fills up quickly, so it is a good idea to start your search as soon as you can. Student accommodation is a wonderful way to meet fellow students in similar shoes.

Prepare for the Weather: Ireland is known for its mild but wet climate. Invest in waterproof jackets and comfortable shoes. Dublin is very walkable.

Get involved! Join one of 120+ clubs and societies from Basketball, Rugby, to Drama, Karting, Space and Robotics. Clubs and Societies are the best way to make friends and connect with student life in Ireland.

Learn How to Get Around: Ireland's public transport includes buses, trains and trams (Luas). Get a Student LEAP travel card for discount fares and use Transport for Ireland (TFI) for real-time public transport information.

Plan Your Budget: Start by estimating your income and expenses per month. Using Budget Apps like Revolut, cooking some home meals 3-4 times a week, and watching for student discounts can pay off in the long run.

International Non-EU Students

Visa and Immigration: Non-EU students from visa required countries will need an entry visa for Ireland - apply well in advance to avoid delays to your journey to Ireland. Upon arrival, all non-EU students must register with the Irish Immigration Service (INIS) and get an Irish Residence Permit (IRP) card.

Get Health Insurance: All non-EEA students must have private health insurance that covers them from day one in Ireland. Proof of insurance is required at the time of registration with immigration authorities.

Working in Ireland as an International Student

Ireland's Employer Ecosystem

Ireland is the European base for over 1,000 leading multinational companies in sectors such as IT, pharmaceuticals, and finance. Major companies like Google, IBM, Meta, Pfizer, Oracle, and Deloitte have all chosen Ireland as their hub, creating a demand for a skilled and educated workforce to support their success.

Working in Ireland while Studying

Students attending a full-time course who have an Irish Residence Permit card are entitled to take up casual/part-time employment while studying in Ireland provided that their course of study is included on the government's list of visa-eligible courses, known as the ILEP.

This will entitle you to undertake part-time work for up to 20 hours per week during term time, and up to 40 hours full-time work per week during two standardised periods of 15 December to 15 January and between 1 June and 30 September. These dates are subject to change and are fixed for all non-EU students, regardless of the actual programme teaching calendar for their course.

In order to work in Ireland you will need to get a Personal Public Service Number (PPSN), but you need to have evidence of a job offer to secure one. The first step is to find work, and then apply for a PPSN. You can find out more from Citizens' Information: citizensinformation.ie

Working in Ireland after you Graduate

After successfully completing your studies you can take advantage of a "stay-back" visa to remain and work in Ireland.

International students who complete an undergraduate degree at DCU can apply for the Third Level Graduate Programme (Stamp 1G). Stamp 1G allows you to work in Ireland for **12 months** from the date of issue of final results.

International students who complete a Master's Degree, a Postgraduate Diploma or a PhD can also apply for the Third Level Graduate Programme (Stamp 1G). This allows you to work in Ireland for **24 months** after you graduate. Full details can be found at: irishimmigration.ie

Scholarship Information

DCU offers a range of International Student Scholarships.

DCU Merit Scholarship

DCU offers partial merit-based scholarships to some non-EU students. You are automatically considered for a scholarship when you apply as a non-EU student to DCU. We'll let you know if you have qualified for a scholarship when we contact you to advise if your application to study at DCU has been successful.

Faculty of Science and Health International Scholarship

This scholarship is available for Non-EU applicants who have received an offer to study an eligible postgraduate programme in the Faculty of Science and Health. Successful applicants will receive a €5,000 fee reduction on the full-time 2026-2027 non-EU tuition fee.

Eligible programmes for 2026-2027 are:

- DC739 - MSc in Diagnostics and Precision Medicine
- DC734 - MSc in Bioprocess Engineering
- DC776 - MSc in Biotherapeutics

Humanities and Social Sciences Bursary

This merit-based bursary is available for high-achieving non-EU applicants who have received an offer to study on a postgraduate programme in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. Successful recipients will receive a €2,000 fee reduction on the full-time 2026-2027 non-EU tuition fees for their postgraduate programme. All non-EU applications to a postgraduate programme in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences are automatically considered for this bursary. Only successful recipients of the bursary will be notified via email.

Faculty of Engineering and Computing International Scholarship

This scholarship is available for non-EU applicants who have received an offer to study on eligible postgraduate programmes in the Faculty of Engineering and Computing. Successful recipients will receive a €5,000 fee reduction on the full-time 2026-2027 non-EU tuition fee.

Eligible programmes for 2026-27 are:

- DC814 - MEng Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering
- DC836 - MSc in Computing
- DC883 - MEng Electronic and Computer Engineering
- DC896 - MSc Electronic and Computer Technology

All non-EU applications to a postgraduate programme in the Faculty of Engineering and Computing are automatically considered for this bursary. Successful recipients of the bursary will be notified via email.

Business School International Scholarship

This scholarship is available for non-EU applicants who have received an offer to study on eligible postgraduate programmes in DCU Business School. Successful recipients will receive a €2,000 fee reduction on the full-time 2026-2027 non-EU tuition fee.

- MSc in International Accounting and Business
- MSc in Global Strategy (Digital Disruption)

Accommodation

On our Glasnevin Campus, our College Park apartments have a dedicated postgraduate block, which is available on a 9-month basis, from September to May. These apartments contain 5 double en suite bedrooms with both wifi and fixed-line internet access.

Our postgraduate apartments on the Glasnevin Campus offer high-quality accommodation for over 100 postgraduate students in the heart of the research community on campus. The accommodation is let on a 50-week basis only, the majority of rooms being let as single occupancy bedrooms, however, a limited number of double occupancy rooms are also available.

On the All Hallows Campus, we have a limited number of rooms available for 9-month occupancy. There are 67 bedrooms available in Purcell House to students at all levels of study. Accommodation is in single or double bedrooms (single occupancy only) with either en suite or shared bathroom facilities. Each bedroom has a study area and wifi access. There is a large communal kitchen and shared lounge areas.

Please note that all students including postgraduates will be charged a €50 administration fee for 2026/2027 when making an application to DCU Rooms.

Student Services and Supports

Student Advice and Learning Skills Centre

The Student Advice and Learning Skills Centre is the place to go for all information on student support at DCU. We offer advice and guidance on everything from settling into university to exam preparation and financial assistance. Students can make a one-to-one appointment or drop in to see a Student Advisor.

The Learning Support Service also offers workshops and one-to-one meetings to help students with various aspects of learning at Third Level. We also offer extensive online resources through DEVELOP, our digital resource hub. Our Writing Centre is very popular with postgraduate students, helping them to enhance their writing skills.

The Centre also offers life coaching on a one-to-one basis or through the Pathways to Success programme.

Entry Requirements

In general, the entry requirement for all taught graduate programmes is a primary degree of at least Second Class Honours standard from a recognised university or degree-awarding body. In some cases, approved equivalent qualification from a recognised professional body will suffice.

As part of the selection process, an interview may be required. In some cases, candidates not possessing the above entry qualification may be admitted provided that they can demonstrate exceptional aptitude or ability and/or substantial relevant work experience in a field related to the programme.

In line with DCU's Recognition of Prior Learning Policy, candidates who do not have the appropriate level of academic attainment for direct entry may apply for access via the Recognition of Prior Learning process.

Prior learning may be formal accredited learning or experiential/uncertified learning which includes the knowledge, skills and personal qualities acquired through life, work experience and study which are not formally attested. English Language Requirements

Applicants whose first language is not English must provide evidence of equivalent competence in the English Language in a recognised English language test, as specified below. The minimum standard in the English language varies by faculty. For more information visit: dcu.ie/registry/english-language-requirements-non-native-speakers-english-registry

Your English language certificate must be awarded within two years of the start date of your DCU programme.

In exceptional circumstances, results in examinations other than those published may be accepted as proof of competence in the English language. This may include non-native speakers of English who have completed their education through the medium of English in a country where English is the official language. Please include the details of any English language examinations and proof of successful completion when applying to DCU.



How to Apply

Postgraduate Taught Programmes

Candidates seeking admission to all full-time and part-time postgraduate taught programmes must apply online through DCU's Student Application Portal which can be accessed at: dcu.ie/applicationportal

Applicants can apply for up to three taught programmes or one research programme when making an application to DCU.

Programmes should be selected in order of preference. The cost of applying is €50 and is a non-refundable fee payable to DCU.

You must upload documentation relevant to your application through your account, such as certified transcripts for every year of study including the overall grade awarded, passport, and, if applicable, the English Language requirement. Other additional documentation may be requested during the application stage and must be provided prior to DCU's assessment.

On receipt of the application fee, your application will be available to view on the system. Applicants are notified by email. It is, therefore, imperative that applicants have a secure email account and review it regularly for updates, as no other means of communication between DCU and prospective applicants will be used. If you are successful and receive an offer, you will be required to make a €500 deposit via the student applicant portal in order to accept your place.

Closing Dates for Applications

EU and non-EU applicants to full-time and part-time postgraduate taught programmes should note that each programme has an initial closing date indicating when applications should be submitted. Applications may be reviewed by DCU Admissions before or after the closing date.

Please note that all Postgraduate programmes offered through DCU have entry requirements. In addition to qualifications, some programmes require additional information and applicants are asked to familiarise themselves with their programme(s) of choice before making an application. 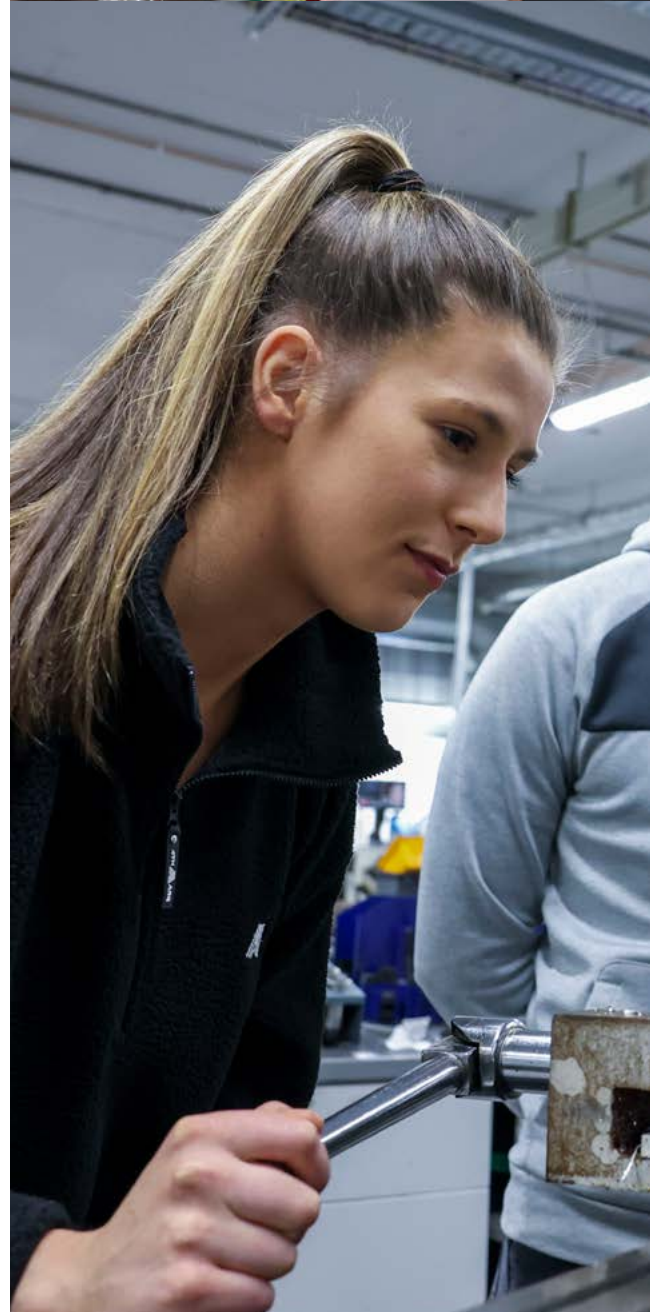

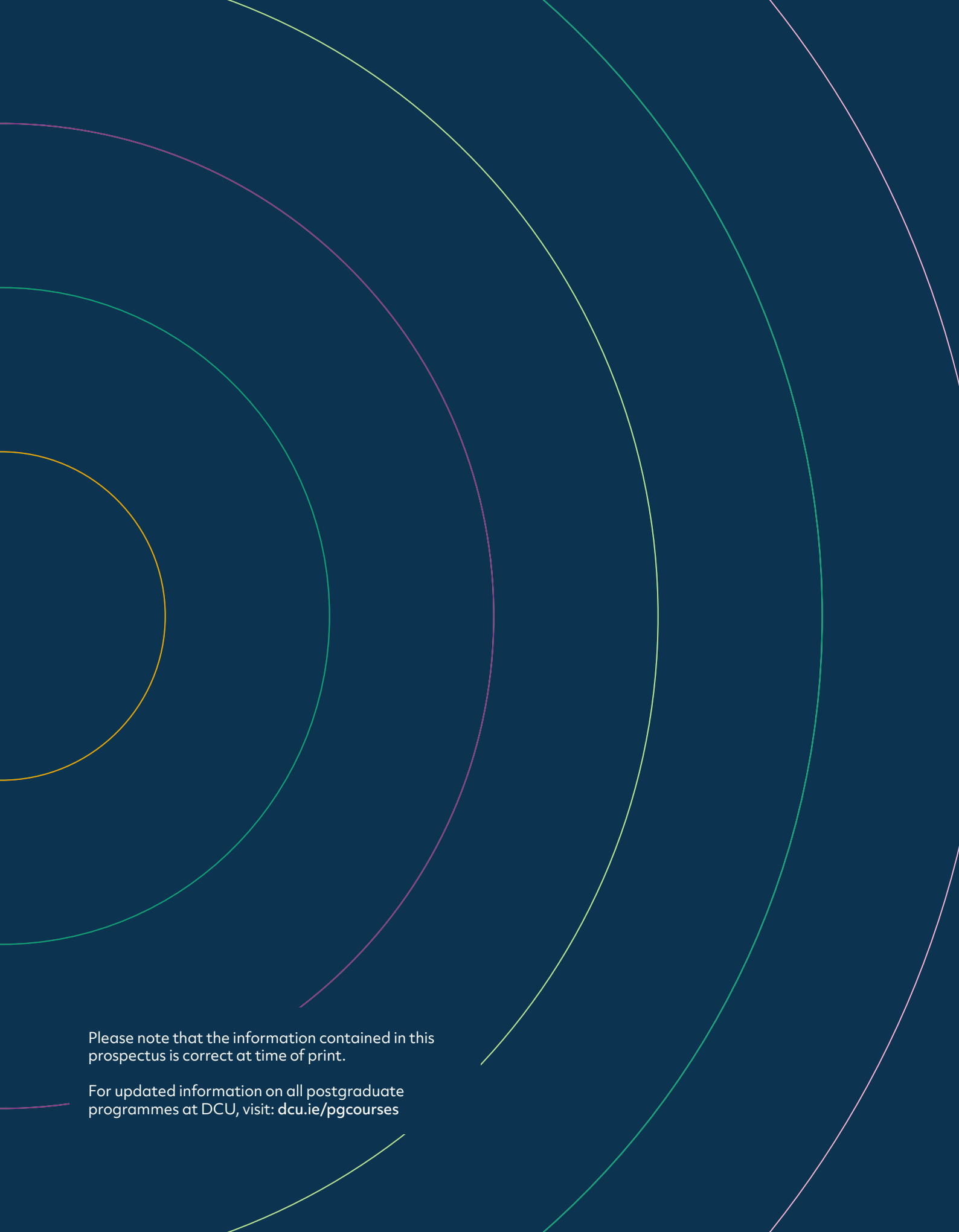
